Set in Chile in 1973, during the last years of president Allende, this film focuses on the attempts made by some liberal priests to build bridges between rich and poor. Against this backdrop, boys from the slums begin to attend an English speaking, catholic school. An upper class boy, Gonzalo, befriends the poor and humble Pedro. Together, they experience the dramatic development in Chile, during the days leading up to the military coup and overthrow of president Allende. Due to the political situation, their fragile friendship is challenged and in the end cannot endure.
